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Hospital Design & Patient Flow Planning Guide

Designing Healthcare Facilities for Efficiency, Safety, and Patient Experience

Purpose

Hospital and clinic design plays a critical role in operational efficiency, infection control, and patient experience. Poorly designed healthcare facilities often experience congestion, long waiting times, staff inefficiencies, and increased operational risk.

This guide provides a structured framework for designing healthcare facilities that support efficient patient flow and safe clinical operations.

1. Zoning the Healthcare Facility

Healthcare facilities should be divided into clearly defined operational zones to ensure smooth movement of patients, staff, and medical supplies.

Typical zones include:

- Reception and waiting areas
- Consultation and clinical treatment areas
- Diagnostic services such as laboratory or imaging
- Pharmacy and billing areas

2. Patient Flow Planning
